#### Inter Faith Network UK - Bad News

On Friday 31 March, IFN received a letter from an official at the Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities saying that further funding would not be given from April 2023 to the Inter Faith Network.

A message requesting support of IFN's work was promptly sent by email on behalf of HFOF to two local Hounslow MPs: Seema Malhotra and Ruth Cadbury who both agreed to use their influence in support of IFN. Emails were also sent to the Secretary of State and Minister for Faith and Communities.

Unfortunately at the time of writing this newsletter it seems unlikely that funding from the government will resume.

# Local MP fighting for interfaith dialogue fundi

Seema Malhotra, the Labour MP for Feltham and Heston, has written to Michael Gove, the Levelling Up, Housing and Communities Secretary, to ask why funding has been withdrawn from the UK's largest organisation supporting interfaith dialogue and action.

or almost four decades, Inter Faith Network UK (IFN) has been dedicated to increasing understanding and cooperation between people of different faiths and growing public awareness of the distinct religious traditions in the UK. IFN also supports hundreds of member bodies, including Hounslow Friends of Faith.

IFN has been supported by annual grants from the government of at least £220,000 for the past decade.

But this year, the government withdrew all funding from IFN, which the MP says was done 'with little notice, putting the future of the charity and its member bodies at risk'.

Seema Malhotra MP said: "Our experience in Hounslow has shown the vital contribution of interfaith dialogue and action in modern Britain, with Christian, Muslim, Sikh, Hindu and Buddhist places of worship, as well as many people of other faiths and no faith. It's important we build understanding and knowledge of one another - it's what lets us work together and celebrate each other's festivals and religious occasions.



"I've seen how Hounslow Friends of Faith brings our communities together in dialogue and action that wouldn't happen otherwise. Every year they organise an Interfaith Walk, so members of the public can visit different places of worship and experience some of the richness and variety of local faith communities.

"In a time when it's more vital than ever before to increase connection and understanding between our diverse communities, it's concerning that the government has made this funding cut without planning for the continued need to promote interfaith dialogue and action."

Rabia al-Basri was a poor Islamic slave girl in eighth century Arabia. One night as she was praying to the Almighty for greater freedom to serve him, her master noticed a divine light surrounding her and experienced a change of heart. He made up his mind to free her the very next morning. According to some historians, she lived as a Sufi ascetic in the desert and went on pilgrimages to holy places. She was known for her trust in divine providence. She shared her spiritual wisdom with both men and women and had many followers. Through her contemplative prayer life and mystic of love, she surrendered herself totally and reached union with God. Here is one of her prayers:

"O my Lord! If I worship thee on account of the fear of hell Burn me in hell And if I worship thee with the hope of paradise Exclude me from it But if I worship thee for thine own sake Then withhold not from me thine eternal beauty."
